#### Discharge escort volunteers

Discharge Escorts leveraged new technology, *EPIC Rover*, to improve the efficiency of the patient discharge process. Using mobile devices, hospital staff can now connect with a discharge volunteer who is anywhere in the hospital. Both patients and staff report the streamlined process avoids delays and is a success.

"Having service hours for college was my first incentive for volunteering," shared Saran Kaba. "But I am really enjoying volunteering and look forward to my shift this week. I've made good friends here at Methodist Hospital and volunteering has broadened my horizons."

Thanks to her years of working as a nurse, Geri knows the comfort a warm blanket and reassuring words can provide. "Making sure that every patient feels valued and is treated with dignity and respect is so important," she says.

Since joining as a volunteer in 2012, Geri has provided kindness and comfort, giving 1,727 hours of service in the emergency center at Methodist Hospital.

"I am overwhelmed by this award," Geri says. "But it takes a whole village and I want to thank everyone for all the support you have shown me. I am humbled by it."

7,298

handcrafted items provided care and comfort to patients and families. **78 volunteers** handcrafted hats, quilts, bags and blankets.

### Lactation clinics

430

hours of education and support by **11 volunteers** at Park Nicollet Clinics and Specialty Centers, and at Methodist Hospital, helping to reduce disparities in breastfeeding rates and support those who choose to breastfeed.

### Doulas support 380

hours of support by **4 doulas** provided at Methodist Hospital and 4 Park Nicollet specialty centers and clinics.

#### Virtual meetings

Methodist Family Partnership Council and the Volunteer Services Advisory Committee continued monthly virtual meetings with **56 volunteers** giving **247 hours**.
