

COVID-19 (Coronavirus) update

For leaders of clinical departments that teach

Please review the following direction on the role and participation of learners in the context of our COVID-19 preparations, and inform teams as appropriate.

- **Residents and fellows:** Residents and fellows are essential members of the care team. They may provide care directly for patients with confirmed or suspected COVID-19 as part of the care team in both the inpatient and ambulatory setting with appropriate supervision.
- **Students:** For all other learners, we have determined that the risks and challenges outweigh the benefit of continuing clinical rotations. Beginning **Monday, March 16**, HealthPartners is canceling all student clinical rotations until further notice. This includes medical students, advanced practice students, nursing students and all other allied health professional students. We will revisit this decision on April 1.

The Institute will communicate with medical students and advanced practice students, and asks that operational leaders communicate with any other student type scheduled for their departments. Please contact the Institute if you would like a draft email for distribution.






What is myPartner?

HealthPartners Institute/Regions Hospital selected to participate in National Education QI Collaborative



The Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) selected HealthPartners Institute/Regions Hospital as a Pathway Leader for Quality Improvement in Healthcare Disparities. The Institute was one of nine training institutions selected to participate in this national QI collaborative. This is an 18-month initiative to develop QI and healthcare disparities curriculum for trainees. This achievement is a recognition of the great health equity and quality improvement work happening at Regions Hospital and the strong partnerships between education and hospital leadership.


The collaborative began in November of 2018 by partnering the Regions Hospital Health Equity team and trainees from the Psychiatry Residency Program to utilize components of the OHPE Health Equity Toolkit which addresses cultural humility and health care disparities. The psychiatry residents indicated that the curriculum increased their understanding of health equity concepts as well as their ability to utilize principles learned to benefit their practice.

Kelly Frisch and Julie Maust recently presented on their work at the 2020 ACGME Annual Educational Conference, marking the end of the ACGME collaborative. Future plans include incorporating specific health care disparity tools into additional training programs within the HealthPartners clinical learning environment.

Julie Maust, GME Director, gives workshop at ACGME Annual Education Conference



OHPE's graduate medical education work was featured at the 2020 Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) Annual Education Conference last month, in a workshop given by Julie Maust regarding the Minnesota Metro Council for Graduate Medical Education's (MMCGME) Operations Committee. MMCGME, a consortium of teaching hospitals in the Twin Cities, created the committee to find operational and administrative efficiencies across training sites with the common goal of improving the experiences of residents and fellows. The Twin Cities are home to 13 major

teaching sites and six sponsoring institutions, who serve 1,300 residents and fellows. Most of these trainees rotate through several different training sites and face different operational processes for the same requirements, which is often duplicative. The Operations Committee has been working for three years to reduce these redundancies.

The workshop highlighted best practices and tools developed by the committee, which Julie co-chairs with her counterpart at the University of Minnesota. Most notable was the resident/fellow training site app, Med Ed To Go, recently released in July 2019. The app offers all Twin Cities learners access to mental health and well-being resources as well as quick, relevant information about their training sites right at their fingertips.

Program Updates

Program of the month: Dermatology Residency Program

The HealthPartners Institute Dermatology Residency program is our newest sponsored residency program. The program was granted ACGME accreditation in 2018, and the first class of residents began their training in July 2019.

The program has more than 40 dermatologists with rich experience in teaching and education.

Residents in the program begin work as junior colleagues and collaborative educators. Clinics are primarily set up as a continuity model. Residents care for their own panel of patients from day one, with support and supervision appropriate to their training. With a focus on abilities of synthesis, they quickly begin to independently develop differential diagnoses, diagnose and treat their own patients.

Faculty help hone appropriate empathy in providing care, while respecting the boundaries between patient and physician. There are on-going and growing opportunities for faculty development within our program.


The residents have clinic weekly at Burnsville, St. Louis Park and HealthPartners Specialty Center and rotate in Dermatopathology at Regions Hospital and in the Park Nicollet Dermatology department. There is also a free-standing dedicated patch test clinic at the Airport Clinic.

Molly Goodier, one of the residents, will be presenting at Gross and Microscopic session at the American Academy of Dermatology (AAD) Annual Meeting which is March 20-24, 2020.
