


EPIC – Consult Discharge Planning Tool: Used to enhance communication from consulting teams to a primary team when a patient is clear for discharge. View [screen shots](#).

HealthPartners Clinical Simulation partners to provide multidisciplinary team training

Last month, HealthPartners Clinical Simulation hosted the first ever Hospital@Home (H@H) multidisciplinary team training with the Regions Hospital Community Paramedics and Hospitalists from Regions, Methodist and Lakeview. The H@H program partners with hospital medicine, community senior care program to care for patients at their home. While the program is not new, it was experienced in providing at-home care and has been an incredible asset to our organization during the COVID-19 pandemic to care for patients at home.

The training is an example of our colleagues partnering to innovate across teams and locations. For the training, HealthPartners Clinical Simulation colleagues designed an experience so that Community Paramedics who are caring for patients at home and Hospitalists in the H@H program can see each other and practice from each other's lenses.

The simulation training provided an opportunity for each team member involved in patient care to see the other's side of practice. It gave the Community Paramedic an opportunity to see how their calls were received and processed by the Hospitalists and vice versa. In future, the training will include team members who are involved in multiple touchpoints of patient care from home to hospital including support team members like case managers and operations colleagues.

The H@H program is on the annual plan for Methodist and Regions Hospital under the innovate and differentiate section of the annual plan. It is an aspect of telemedicine that has grown in demand due to the pandemic. As the use of virtual care and telemedicine grows, simulation training will enhance the ability for care team members to truly understand the role that their partners play in patient care through multiple touchpoints. The HealthPartners Clinical Simulation team's ability to facilitate realistic scenarios with learning objectives, goals, and thoughtful planning provides a safe space for care providers to observe and practice in a static scenario.
