## **PURPOSE**

To establish guidelines for employment outside of HealthPartners Institute residency and fellowship training.

## **SCOPE**

This policy applies to all HealthPartners Institute-sponsored post-graduate medical training programs accredited by the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME), the Council on Podiatric Medical Education (CPME) and the Commission on Dental Accreditation (CODA).

## **DEFINITION**

<u>Moonlighting</u> — Refers to any and all clinical activities outside of the scope of the training program.

<u>Internal Moonlighting</u> - Voluntary, compensated, clinically-related work (not related to training requirements) performed within the institution in which the trainee is in training or at any of its related participating sites.

<u>External Moonlighting</u> - Voluntary, compensated, clinically-related work performed outside the institution where the trainee is in training or at any of its related participating sites.

## **RESPONSIBILITIES/REQUIREMENTS**

- A. A trainee must not be required to engage in moonlighting activities.
- B. PGY–1 residents are not permitted to moonlight. Note: Dental residents are exempt from this requirement.
- C. Moonlighting is permissible so long as, in the judgment of the Program Director, such activity does not interfere with the trainee's ability to meet their educational obligations in a satisfactory manner. The Program Director has the right to restrict a trainee from moonlighting.
- D. Trainee performance will be monitored by the Program Director for the effect of these activities upon performance. Adverse effects may lead to withdrawal of permission to moonlight.

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- E. A trainee who moonlights is not provided professional liability insurance by HealthPartners Institute or its affiliates for that activity. The professional liability policy for trainees does <u>not</u> cover any activities that are not part of the formal education program, including but not limited to, moonlighting activities.
- F. Trainee moonlighting activities are governed by a separate written agreement between the trainee and the entity for which they will provide the moonlighting services.
- G. Trainees on J-1 Visas are not permitted to be employed outside the training program. A trainee on an H-1B Visa wishing to moonlight <u>must</u> obtain a separate H-1B Visa for <u>each</u> facility where they work outside the training program. For all other non-citizen legal work statuses, please check with the Office of Health Professional Education on moonlighting eligibility.
- H. Trainees desiring to moonlight must seek permission from the Program Director in advance. If granted, the Program Director must provide a written statement of permission that will be made part of the trainee's file.
- Trainees are not allowed to moonlight on a service where they are simultaneously fulfilling a rotation.
- J. Trainees must report all internal and external moonlighting hours on a monthly basis via their program's clinical and educational work hour tracking process. Failure to report moonlighting hours can result in the loss of moonlighting privileges.

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
