From the Office of Health Professional Education

A new year is time for reflection. This year especially, we're reflecting on the last five years – three of them spent grappling with the onset and recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic. When we're in the midst of taking care of our patients and members and going from one crisis to another, it can be easy to forget the community we are building as we work together. Here's a reminder of the work you have all contributed to, and why we're thankful to our trainees, clinicians, program staff and our Health Professional Education community.

- We've seen 78 percent growth in clinician training programs in the last five years, and 200 percent growth in APC Fellowships in just 2022
- We developed two Longitudinal student programs, APEX and REACH
- The SharedSpace4Learning application helped us create and track 3200 student learner rotations for over 60 learner types in 2022
- We've had over 50,000 simulation participants
- Our GME programs received zero citations from the ACGME all while supporting our clinical learning environment through two emergency categorizations during the COVID-19 pandemic
- Facilitated development of institution scorecards for GME programs
- The Emergency Medicine Residency program implemented "2nd look" opportunity for residency candidates
- Developed work group to navigate, support and streamline process of system access for residents and fellows during onboarding
- Partnered to develop an unconscious bias training for clinicians
- Piloted workforce planning approach with Laboratory Services
- Planning commenced for a new Simulation Center space at Regions Hospital
- Organized personal storage space for medical students at Regions Hospital
- Implemented processes to track non-employed student and resident learner compliance with HealthPartners' annual vaccination program
- Continued work managing the annual process of recruitment and orientation coordinating the review
 of thousands of applications and hundreds of students for residency and fellowship positions training
 at HealthPartners
- Developed a system wide approach to host and track observers including an updated student and observer policy



APC fellowship programs accepting applications

The application cycle is currently open for Primary Care, Psychiatry, Hospital Medicine, TRIA Orthopedics and Trauma/Acute Care Surgery APC Fellowship programs with a targeted start date of July 2023. APC Fellowship programs are located at Regions, Methodist, both HealthPartners and Park Nicollet primary care clinics, and multiple TRIA sites. Current HealthPartners employees at those sites are encouraged to apply.

Our APC Fellowship programs continue to grow and serve as an effective workforce strategy with a retention rate of 89 percent. We've established APC Fellowship programs in Psychiatry, Emergency Medicine, Hospital Medicine, and Primary Care, Cardiology, TRIA Orthopedics and Trauma/Acute care. In 2022, the TRIA Orthopedics APC Fellowship program successfully completed its first year, with the program's first APC fellow transitioning to a staff role in April 2023 and The Cardiology Fellowship program welcomed its first APC fellow.

HealthPartners Advanced Practice Clinician (APC) Fellowships offer structured and comprehensive post-graduate programs to Physician Assistants and Nurse Practitioners in multiple areas of medicine. Mentoring the future - calling all educators to create a mentor profile in SS4L

Since rolling out the HealthPartners system-wide observer process in August, we have enrolled 565 observers, 298 mentors, and have created 501 observation experiences. Thank you to all who have taught or participated in these observation experiences!

We're calling all educators who are willing to mentor observers to create or update your mentor profile in SS4L. Follow these simple steps to get started:

- Create or update your mentor profile in SS4L
- Send the observer this <u>Getting Started Guide</u> and have them inform you once they're in
- Approve their profile in the "Role Approvals" menu
- Create their observation experience and assign them as the learner

Observers who are planning on shadowing a HealthPartners colleague can follow these steps:

- Create your observer profile in SS4L using this <u>Getting Started guide</u> and let the educator know when you are set up in the system
- Your mentor will create the experience for you and you'll be notified you've been matched up
- · Read through and check off the compliance/onboarding tasks for your experience


Food options available to Residents and Fellows at Regions Hospital

Food options:


- Resident/Fellow Lounge, South 2nd Floor: Food options for on call residents when cafeteria and coffee shop are closed





How to navigate to our site on myPartner:


By clicking on Departments and typing in "Clinical" or scrolling down to the A-D column:

One drive to replace K drive

In 2023, <u>Microsoft OneDrive</u> will become our standard tool for personal work files, replacing K: drives for colleagues. OneDrive helps securely store documents, allowing only you to view and edit your files. It also gives the flexibility to collaborate with others on documents you choose to share.

When is this change taking place?

To minimize disruption to your daily work, we're introducing this change in stages:

Now through March 1: colleagues should transfer files and folders from K: drive to OneDrive.

March 2: documents cannot be edited or saved to K: drives.

May 2: K: drives will be removed for all colleagues and files stored there will no longer be accessible. Before this date, all essential documents must be transferred from K: to OneDrive.
