





HealthPartners Clinical Simulation Monthly Update

March 2023



Simulation as an introduction to healthcare careers

Early in March, HealthPartners Clinical Simulation team visited the Washington Technology Magnet School in St. Paul to teach biomedical students the fundamentals of medical care. During the visit, students were given the opportunity to perform healthcare activities on mannequins, experience exposure, interact with medical equipment and technology, and learn about healthcare careers. The simulation activity provided an engaging experience for students, who learned about human anatomy and how bodies functioned, and eagerly practiced techniques of intubation, performing CPR, and even drawing blood on mannequins.

The students also had an opportunity to explore healthcare careers and learn from actual physicians and medical experts. Our team of experts from HealthPartners included resident physicians, laboratory staff, and simulation experts who aimed to teach fundamentals, provide exposure, and engage students in an interactive experience. Daniel VanDerhoef, MD and Brittany Kimball, MD are both chief residents in the University of Minnesota Internal Medicine Residency Program and interested in engaging with the community. Dr. Kimball helped students practice intubation and ventilation, while Dr. VanDerhoef demonstrated a 3D Ultrasound and provided an overview of anatomy. Erin Gregor, Medical Lab Scientist, and an expert in Venipuncture, helped students practice drawing blood and starting IVs. Simulation experts, Blake Katzenmaier and Erin MagnusonHall, along with other team members, demonstrated Cardiac Arrest Management (AED, CPR, Ventilation) techniques and provided information about career paths in healthcare.

The Washington Technology Magnet School offers a pathway program where students choose a path for biomedical or engineering in 10th grade. The visit was important as part of an ongoing partnership between the pathway program and Regions Hospital. Meagan O'Brien is a faculty member who has worked at the school for over 10 years and designs the curriculum. The biomedical pathway, led by Meagan, partners with Regions for career explorations, and the activity with HealthPartners Clinical Simulation helps students apply the skills they learn throughout the year in a practical setting while interacting with technology.

Partnering for Patient Safety Awareness week

The Simulation Center hosted the Room of Errors event in partnership with the patient safety team during Patient Safety Awareness Week at Regions Hospital last month. The event was a success with colleagues as they took part and learned how to be on the lookout for potential safety concerns every day as they take care of patients at Regions Hospital.

Life-saving training

Training conducted by the Simulation Center helped save the life of a visitor at Hudson Hospital and Clinic. The Code Blue Simulation is a life-like training session specifically designed to improve the way teams respond in 5 minutes following a cardiac or respiratory arrest. Simulation Center expansion

The simulation center at Regions Hospital is currently undergoing significant enhancements thanks in part to a \$2.5 million donation from the Otto Bremer Trust. The money will be used to create a new space for simulation activities, free-up a hospital unit for future clinical care and pay for high-tech equipment that will improve medical education and enhance quality of care – just like it did at Hudson Hospital in December.

Program Updates

Fellowship program has a new name and celebrates key milestone

The Regions Hospital/HealthPartners Institute Emergency Medicine Physician Assistant Fellowship is celebrating its tenth anniversary this year. The emergency medicine clinical postgraduate education program was initiated in 2012 in response to the growing need for physician assistant providers with knowledge and experience to care for the increasingly complex patient population in emergency medicine and expanded bed capacity. The EMPA fellowship depends on a collaborative relationship with the Regions Emergency Medicine Residency and takes advantage of excellent didactic education and practical skills gained through this relationship as well as modeling a team-based approach to patient care.

The Regions EMPA Fellowship, formerly termed residency, was started during a period of relatively few such programs and was the first of its kind in Minnesota. Today there are two other clinical postgraduate emergency medicine programs in the state and over fifty in the nation. A total of 25 fellows graduated from our program by the end of 2022. We made a change in the title of our program to The Regions Hospital/HealthPartners Institute Emergency Medicine Physician Assistant Fellowship to align with our institutional naming practice and the majority of postgraduate PA and APC programs nationally.

REACH program gets ready to welcome 6th cohort

Spring brings mixed feelings in the REACH LIC as one academic year ends and another begins. 2022/2023 brought the 5th cohort of students into the REACH Regions Hospital Equitable, Affordable, Community Health LIC program, an idea initially conceived by Kelly Frisch, MD and Paula Scarda, MD in late 2017 and entrusted to Drs. Rachel Dahms and Ashley Dohlen as Co-Directors. The REACH program is a unique longitudinal integrated clerkship which includes six 3rd year medical students from the University of Minnesota who interviewed specifically for the 10 month-long program at Regions because of their passion for studying and improving the social determinants of health for their patients. Students complete core clinical clerkships in Obstetrics & Gynecology, Psychiatry, Neurology, Internal Medicine, Surgery & Emergency Medicine at Regions as well as an elective of their choosing, a REACH QI project, and volunteering weekly at a People Incorporated mental health facility. This year the students work and research at P.I. culminated in a fruitful, day-long Design Event at the People Incorporated headquarters in Eagan in March. Results from the REACH group research was used in Ideation sessions with PI decision-makers company-wide to create recommendations for improvement of care for clients, and is also designed to increase satisfaction and retention of mental health providers within the residences. Well done REACH students for this important work!





The 2022/2023 REACH group will commence with a lunch to celebrate later this month. Interviews have been completed and work begun to welcome the incoming 6th REACH cohort in June.
