

## Medical Injectable Specialty Drug List

*(Benefit Parity)*

These medical injectable medications are all designated as “Specialty”. Specialty medicines are usually prescribed by doctors who treat chronic and complex disease. These medical injectable medications may be administered by a healthcare professional in a healthcare setting such as clinic offices, outpatient hospitals, or home-infusion. Some may be dispensed by a pharmacy and sent to either a healthcare provider to administer or to a patient to self-administer.
